#### NOTICE OF MOTION

(Motion for particulars/ to strike the Statement of Claim, returnable July 11, 2018)

The defendant, Richard Molyneux, will make a Motion to a Judge presiding over the Commercial List on Wednesday July 11, 2018 at 10:00 a.m., or as soon after that time as the Motion can be heard at the court house, 330 University Avenue, 7th Floor, Toronto, Ontario, M5G 1R7.

**PROPOSED METHOD OF HEARING:** The Motion is to be heard:

[X] orally.

#### THE MOTION IS FOR:

- (a) An Order striking out the Statement of Claim and dismissing this action as against the defendant, Richard Molyneux;
- (b) In the alternative, an Order for particulars of the following paragraphs of the Statement of Claim in this proceeding in accordance with the Demand for Particulars delivered on May 15, 2018: Paragraphs 1(a); 1(b); 1(c); 1(d); 1(e); 1(f); 1(g); 37; 41, 43, 51; 57; 58; 59; 61; 63; 64; 65; 66: 68; 69; 70; 74; 75; 76; 77; 78; 79; 81; 82; 84; 86; 87; 89; 92; 93; 101; 103; 104; 114(a); 115; 116; 117; 119; 120; 121; 122; 125; 127; 128; and, 129;
- (c) The costs of this motion on a substantial indemnity basis; and,
- (d) Such further and other Relief as to this Honourable Court may seem just.

#### THE GROUNDS FOR THE MOTION ARE:

- (a) The plaintiffs commenced this action on November 7, 2017 against 32 defendants, ten of whom are unknown. The Statement of Claim (the "Pleading") is a lengthy, 132 paragraph pleading that alleges approximately six causes of action against all of the defendants. The plaintiffs claim general, special, aggravated and punitive damages jointly and severally against all of the defendants on the basis of each cause of action.
- (b) In the Pleading, the defendant Richard Molyneux ("Molyneux") is identified as one of four "Guarantor Conspirators", as one of 24 "Conspirators", and as one of six "Guarantors" (as therein defined). The factual allegations against the defendants are made against various groupings defendants. As such, the Pleading fails to disclose the case being made against Molyneux as an individual defendant.

- (c) The plaintiffs broadly allege the following causes of action collectively against each defendant in the action: (i) defamation; (ii) injurious falsehood; (iii) intentional interference with economic relations; (iv) civil conspiracy; and, (v) unjust enrichment in the first paragraph of the Pleading.
- (d) The Pleading fails to comply with the rules of pleading for the causes of action asserted, pleads them with insufficient particularity
- (e) On May 15, 2018, Molyneux delivered a Demand for Particulars with regard to the Statement of Claim. On May 23, 2018, Molyneux, other defendants, and the plaintiffs appeared before the Honourable Justice Hainey at a 9:30 a.m. hearing.
- (f) At the hearing, the Honourable Justice Hainey ordered that the plaintiffs respond to the demands for particulars made by Molyneux and other defendants by June 15, 2018.
- (g) As of June 29, 2018, the plaintiffs have not delivered a response to Molyneux's demand for particulars. In doing so, the plaintiffs have failed to comply with a timetable as ordered by a Judge, and have breached an interlocutory order of this Court.
- (h) Rule 25.06(8), which requires that allegations of fraud, breach of trust, malice or intent be pleaded with full particulars, applies to each and every cause of action alleged by the plaintiffs:
  - (i) The torts of injurious falsehood and intentional interference with economic relations each require that the tortfeasor acted intentionally.
  - (ii) With respect to the tort of civil conspiracy, the Conspiracy (as defined in the Pleading) alleged is that the defendants conspired to cause economic harm to the plaintiffs. Therefore, in the circumstances of the Pleading, the conspiracy requires a finding of an intent to injure, or knowledge that an injury is likely to occur.

- (iii) In their claim for unjust enrichment, the plaintiffs claim that the defendants received a benefit resulting from their participation in an unlawful short selling attack. Accordingly, this allegation also involves an allegation of intent or malice against the defendants.
- (iv) The defamation claimed against the defendants involves an allegation that unspecified malicious and false statements were made.
- (i) The Pleading falls short of making Molyneux aware of the claims made against him, all of which require full particulars. Furthermore, because the plaintiffs plead intentional torts, the claims against Molyneux engage Rule 25.06(8) of the *Rules of Civil Procedure*. When Rule 25.06(8) is engaged, it is mandatory that a pleading contain full particulars as they are required elements to support the causes of action pleaded. As full particulars are not present in the Pleading, it is clearly deficient with regard to all causes of action alleged, as discussed below.

#### **Injurious Falsehood**

- (j) Actions for injurious falsehood involve the publication of false statements, either orally or in writing, reflecting adversely on the plaintiffs' business or property, and so calculated as to induce persons not to deal with the plaintiffs. There must be a showing that the published statements are untrue, that they were made maliciously, that they were made without just cause or excuse, and that the plaintiff suffered special damages.
- (k) The Pleading fails to plead facts particularizing what alleged false statement was published by Molyneux, the form of that false statement, how such a false statement reflected adversely on the plaintiffs' business, and the harm suffered by the plaintiffs as a result of the false statement.

(l) The Pleading does not allege any particular malicious conduct by Molyneux. The particulars of an alleged false statement are not pleaded. As a result, there are also no particulars pleaded to suggest that Molyneux believed any such statement to be untrue.

#### **Intentional Interference with Economic Relations**

- (m) Intentional interference with economic relations requires that the defendant intend to cause loss to the plaintiff, either as an end in itself or as a means of, for example, enriching himself. If the loss suffered by the plaintiff is merely a foreseeable consequence of the defendant's actions, that is not enough. A pleading for unlawful interference with economic relations requires a pleading that a defendant committed an actionable wrong directed against a third party that intentionally caused the plaintiff economic harm.
- (n) The Pleading does not disclose full particulars of an actionable wrong committed against a third party. Nor does the Pleading specify what conduct of Molyneux is alleged to have interfered in the plaintiffs' economic relations, when such conduct occurred, with whom, what economic relations were interfered with, the particulars of which investors suffered a loss, and how the plaintiffs were harmed and to what extent financially.

#### Conspiracy

(o) The plaintiffs plead unlawful conspiracy against all of the defendants. A claim for unlawful conspiracy requires a factual basis to establish that Molyneux used unlawful means with knowledge that his acts were aimed at the plaintiffs and knowing or constructively knowing his acts would result in injury to the plaintiffs.

(p) The material facts in the Pleading do not contain the particulars of the Conspiracy as against Molyneux. The Pleading does not establish who the parties to the Conspiracy were, when the Conspiracy was entered into, what the terms of the Conspiracy were, what Molyneux's involvement in the Conspiracy is alleged to be, what acts Molyneux took in furtherance of the conspiracy, and what acts Molyneux undertook to hide the conspiracy.

#### **Unjust Enrichment**

- (q) A claim for unjust enrichment requires that the defendant receive a benefit, that the plaintiff experience a corresponding deprivation, and that there be no juristic reason for the enrichment.
- (r) The plaintiffs' claims of unjust enrichment against Molynueux is premised on alleged profits made by short-selling Callidus' shares. However, short-selling is not unlawful.
- (s) The plaintiffs allege that they suffered an alleged deprivation as a result of defamation/interference with economic relations/ conspiracy. These causes of action are not properly pleaded. Furthermore, there are no allegations that Molyneux engaged in short-selling shares, and it is not pleaded that Molyneux received any specific benefit.
- (t) In the circumstances of the general facts the plaintiffs have included in the Pleading, the unjust enrichment claims are grounded in intentional torts and therefore require full particulars.

#### **Defamation**

(u) An action for defamation requires pleading with particularity. The plaintiffs must describe the allegedly defamatory words; who the plaintiffs allege uttered the defamatory words, to whom the defamatory words were spoken and when the defamatory words were spoken.

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- (v) The plaintiffs have not established a cause of action in defamation against Molyneux. They have instead made general, vague, and unspecified allegations of defamation. For example, paragraphs 64, 65 and 73-77, 86-92, of the Pleading omit particulars of:
  - (i) The words spoken or otherwise distributed that are alleged to be defamatory;
  - (ii) The date on which the words were spoken or otherwise distributed;
  - (iii) Where the words were spoken or otherwise distributed;
  - (iv) Who is alleged to have spoken the defamatory words, or what words were spoken by Molyneux; and,
  - (v) The names of the persons to whom the words were spoken or otherwise published.

#### **Damages Claimed**

- (w) The Pleading broadly claims general and aggravated damages as against all of the defendants, jointly and severally.
- (x) Consequently, the Pleading fails to disclose the amount of damages claimed as against Molyneux and which claims for relief are connected to which damages. Furthermore, the plaintiffs have claimed punitive damages as against all defendants, including Molyneux. The Pleading fails to set out the means of Molyneux, which is a material fact.

- (y) As such, Molyneux requires the particulars of the damages claimed against him.
- (z) Rules 3.04, 25.06, 25.10, 57.03 and 60.13 of the Rules of Civil Procedure; and,
- (aa) Such further and other grounds as the lawyers may advise.

- 1. I am a legal assistant with the law firm of Solmon Rothbart Goodman LLP, the lawyers for the defendant, Richard Molyneux ("Molyneux"), and, as such, have knowledge of the matters contained in this affidavit, save and except where I state that I have received information from other sources, in which case I verily believe the same to be true.
- 2. The Statement of Claim in this proceeding was issued on November 11, 2017.

- 3. On May 15, 2018, counsel for Molyneux delivered a Demand for Particulars (the "Demand") to the Plaintiffs, a true copy of which is attached hereto and marked as **Exhibit "A"**.
- 4. On May 23, 2018, counsel for the parties attended a 9:30 a.m. hearing in front of the Honourable Justice Hainey, who ordered that the Plaintiffs respond to the Demand by June 15, 2018. A true copy of the Endorsement is attached hereto and marked as **Exhibit "B"**.
- 5. On June 4, 2018, Melvyn Solmon ("Solmon"), counsel for Molyneux, was copied on an email sent from Linda Plumpton ("Plumpton"), counsel for the Anson Defendants, to David Moore ("Moore"), counsel for the Plaintiffs, noting that the Plaintiffs had not complied with the Endorsement of Justice Hainey. The Endorsement required that the Plaintiffs respond to Plumpton's clients' Demand for Particulars by June 1, 2018. A true copy of this email is attached hereto and marked as **Exhibit "C"**.
- 6. On June 7, 2018, Solmon was copied on an email sent from Plumpton to Moore, stating that the response to Plumpton's Demand for Particulars had still not yet been received, despite assurances by Moore that they would be sent. A true copy of this email is attached hereto and marked as **Exhibit "D"**.
- 7. Almost two weeks passed and no response to Plumpton's Demand for Particulars was received, as indicated in an email to Moore, to which Solmon was copied on June 19, 2018, a true copy of which is attached hereto and marked as **Exhibit "E"**. In this email, Plumpton stated her position that she intended to proceed with a motion to strike on July 11, 2018 and ask that any particulars received be disregarded.

- 8. On June 25, 2018, Alexi Wood, who had also submitted a Demand for Particulars on behalf of his clients, copied Solmon on an email to Moore stating that his clients would also be moving to strike on July 11, 2018. A true copy of this email is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "F".
- 9. On June 26, Solmon sent an email to Moore, advising that Molyneux took the same position and would also be bringing a motion on July 11, 2018. A true copy of this email is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "G".

  - a) the steps taken to hide details of the conspiracy, aside from the example provided in that paragraph; and

  - a) what whistleblower complaints were false and defamatory; and
  - b) whether Mr. Molyneux is alleged to have agreed to file "false and defamatory whistleblower complaints".

- 28. With regard to paragraph 69, the particulars of what profitable short selling of Callidus shares was carried out by Mr. Molyneux, including full particulars.
- 29. With regard to paragraph 70, what is alleged to have been false and defamatory, including particulars of the "illegal accounting practices with respect to loans".

  - a) the allegations of what words were defamatory, the particular words, who published them,
     to whom they were published and when;
  - b) how Mr. Molyneux profited and what amount.

- 31. With regard to paragraph 75, who is it alleged Mr. Molyneux contacted (as a journalist) and what false allegations and what leaks is it alleged that he leaked, to whom and when and particulars of the "false allegations".
- 32. With regard to paragraph 76, particulars of how Mr. Molyneux is alleged to have engaged Livesey and/or to have agreed to compensate Livesey for writing a "negative story targeting Callidus, Catalyst and their principals", what negative story and full particulars of what Mr. Molyneux is alleged to have done.
- 33. With regard to paragraph 77, the information alleged to have been "fed to Livesey", if it is alleged that Mr. Molyneux did so, including;
  - a) the words spoken or otherwise distributed that are alleged to be defamatory;
